San Diego County Regional Airport Authority	A	Advisory Vote Only. Should Airport Authority and government officials work toward obtaining 3,000 acres at MCAS Miramar by 2020 for a commercial airport, providing certain conditions are met?	
City of San Diego	B	Charter Amendment. Would require voter approval for any increases in retirement system benefits for public employees.	
	C	Charter Amendment. Would allow the City to contract out services if determined to be more economical and efficient.	
City of Carlsbad	D	Amend General Plan to incorporate provisions of the "Preserve the Flower and Strawberry Fields and Save Carlsbad Taxpayers' Money" Measure?	
	E	Amend General Plan to incorporate provisions of the "Save the Strawberry and Flower Growing Fields Act of 2006."

Carlsbad Unified School District	P	\$198 million in bonds for school improvements.	
Santee School District	R	\$60 million in bonds for school improvements.	
Julian-Cuyamaca Fire Protection District	S	Benefit fee for construction of a new fire station and maintenance of district's real property.	Requires 2/3
Tri-City Healthcare District	T	\$596 million in bonds for district improvements.	
Rincon Ranch Community Services District	U	Special tax override, for a period of 10 years, for road maintenance.	
Boulevard Community Planning Area	V	Would disband existing "Sponsor" group and create a "Planning" Group with seven members.
